Full grain leather

Full grain leather has the best and highest quality among all types of natural leather. Our company uses the most modern tanning techniques to produce this highly durable and attractive product.



Top grain leather

Top grain leather is produced by animal skin that has some defects on its surface, which therefore, cannot be used for the production of full grain leather. It can be made into a top grain leather.

Genuine leather

Genuine leather is said to be slightly lower in quality than full grain leather. It is almost impossible to distinguish full grain leather from the genuine one, unless you are professional. Perhaps the only difference between these two types of leather is that genuine leather tends to lose its original luster in a few years after use, while full grain leather becomes more beautiful as time goes.

Split leather

Split leather is made from the middle layer of the skin. This layer may be the middle or lower layer of the epidermis. For this reason, this type of leather is very fragile and maybe a little weak. In addition, split leather often has many cracks. That is why split leather has a more limited use. Tanners, of course, do a lot of work on improving the quality of this type of leather, which increases its durability and quality. An important advantage of split leather is its keen price.





Bonded leather

Bonded leather is made from mixing shredded leather scraps and fibers, similar to the production of paper. It is then formed into a roll using adhesive or other bonding materials and extruded onto a fiber or paper backing cloth. After the roll is formed, it undergoes drying to reduce its moisture content. Since it usually contains 10 to 17 percent leather fibers, some industry experts expressed that they do not consider it as real leather.



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
